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PRELUDE SOCIAL STORY WORSHIP GROUPS HOME

PROVIDING TIME FOR FUN INTERACTION
15 MINUTES

MADE TO PLAY

an activity that encourages learning through following guidelines and working as a group



Pray for your group before they arrive. Pray for those who might visit your group for the first time. Thank God that Jesus cared more about looking out for others than Himself! Reflect on the people God has placed in your life to support you. Ask God to help the kids be thoughtful and aware of how they can look out for those around them.

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BASIC TRUTH


I should treat others the way I want to be treated.

1. EARLY ARRIVER

WHAT YOU NEED: Offering container

WHAT YOU DO:

- Welcome kids by name as they arrive.
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Encourage kids to join you in a seated circle.
- Ask:
 - "What was your favorite thing you did this week and why?"
 - "What was your least favorite thing you did this week?"
- Once enough kids have arrived, explain that you're going to lead them in a game called I Spy.
 - Share that you're going to pick an object in the room that everyone can easily see and give a hint about the item to help them guess what it is.
 - For example, "I spy something with four legs." (chair)
- Give the kids some time to guess the item until it's identified.
- After a few rounds, allow older kids to select the item and lead the game.
- Continue as time and interest allow.

* 2. BE ON THE LOOKOUT!

[LIVE FOR GOD | APPLICATION ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: "Bottom Line Labels" Activity Page, craft paper tubes, stapler, washi tape, markers, and a permanent marker

WHAT YOU DO:

- Give each kid a pair of paper tubes to make a pair of binoculars!
- Use the stapler to staple the two tubes together on both ends for the kids.
- Once stapled together, read the Bottom Line on the label from the "Bottom Line Labels" Activity Page aloud: **look out for one another.**
- Set out the markers and washi tape.
- Encourage the kids to decorate their binoculars with the markers and washi tape.
- Give each kid one label from the "Bottom Line Labels" Activity Page.
- Instruct the kids to add the label to one side of their binoculars.
- As kids finish, encourage them to hold their binoculars up to their eyes and repeat: **"look out for one another!"**
- Use the permanent marker to help the kids write their name or initials on the inside of one of the craft paper tubes.
- Set the binoculars aside for the Prayer Activity.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"I love the binoculars you all made! We use binoculars to see something that's really far away more clearly. But guess what? There are needs ALL around us every single day. Jesus showed us the best example of looking out for others—He kept His focus on other people instead of Himself! We can practice this too.

"We can ask God to take our focus off of us and help us look for what the people around us really need! Of course, some needs require adult help. But maybe a friend dropped all of their coloring supplies, or a sibling took a hard fall and could use a hug. There are ways you can look out for others right now. You can always offer a hug or a helping hand. Let these binoculars remind you to live like Jesus as we **look out for one another.**" (*Shape your hands into binoculars, and hold them up to your eyes and look around.*)

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3. SING IT! VERSE REVIEW

[HEAR FROM GOD | MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: Bible marked at Philippians 2:5

WHAT YOU DO:

- Invite the kids to sit in a circle.
- Select a kid to open the Bible marked at Philippians 2:5.
- Read the verse aloud.
- Invite the kids to repeat the Memory Verse with you several times.
- Lead the kids to sing the Memory Verse to the tune of "The More We Get Together."
 - For the NIrV, it is:
 - "As you deal with one another, one another, one another
 - ("The more we get together, together, together)
 - As you deal with one another, you think and act as Jesus did."
 - (The more we get together, the happier we'll be.)
 - Philippians 2:5
 - (Repeat the last line again—"the happier we'll be.")
 - For the NIV, it is:
 - "In your relationships with one another, one another, one another
 - ("The more we get together, together, together)
 - In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus."
 - (The more we get together, the happier we'll be.)
 - Philippians 2:5
 - (Repeat the last line again—"the happier we'll be.")
- Repeat the verse to the tune several times together.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Singing the Memory Verse is a GREAT way to memorize it! Sometimes, when we're too focused on ourselves, we forget to pay attention to the needs of those around us. This verse reminds us to think and act as Jesus would. Hint: Jesus always put others first! This week, you can sing the Memory Verse to yourself as a reminder to think and act like Jesus did. Ask God to help you live more like Jesus and **look out for one another.**"

an activity that creates space for personal understanding and application



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4. PRAY AND DISMISS

[PRAY TO GOD | PRAYER ACTIVITY]

WHAT YOU NEED: *Optional: binoculars from "Be on the Lookout!" Activity*

WHAT YOU DO:

Option 1:

- Give each kid the pair of binoculars they made in the "Be on the Lookout!" Activity.
- Encourage the kids to hold their binoculars up to their eyes and repeat: **"look out for one another"** several times.
- Close your group in prayer.

Option 2:

- Gather the group together in a circle.
- Show the kids how to hold their hands up to their faces like binoculars.
- Encourage the kids to hold their hands up to their faces like binoculars, pretend to look around, and repeat: **"look out for one another"** several times.
- Close your group in prayer.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Dear God, thank You for loving us so much You sent Your Son, Jesus, to rescue us and to show us how to live! We want to think and act as Jesus would everywhere we go. Please help us to **look out for one another** this week, and to do what we can to help when we see a need. Thank You for loving us. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

As adults arrive to pick up, encourage the kids to show off their binoculars and share how Jesus showed us how to **look out for one another**.
