Opening Activity



What You Need

- "My Superhero Cape" Activity Page
- Coloring Supplies

① What You Do

Pray for your group before they arrive. → Pray for those who might visit your group for the first time. Thank God for the true story of Joseph, a reminder that even when life feels tough or confusing, God is still at work! Reflect on a time you went through something tough and couldn't see how God was using it until later. Thank God for being faithful. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you communicate to kids they can trust God no matter what! Pray that your group would trust God with their big and small struggles. Pray that they would learn to look for how He is working even when life doesn't go as planned.

1. Direct the kids to sit in a circle.
 2. Hand out a "My Superhero Cape" Activity Page to every kid.
 3. Set the coloring supplies in the center of the group.
 4. Encourage the kids to create their own superhero name and write it on the line at the top.
- Help any pre-readers with spelling if needed.
5. Instruct the kids to write the first letter of their superhero name in the center of the cape.
 6. Let them decorate the cape with coloring supplies however they'd like.

② What You Say

"I love your superhero names AND your capes. They're so colorful!
[TRANSITION] Today, we'll hear about someone who received a colorful coat that started a crazy chain of events. Come with me!"

Transition → Lead your group to the Large Group area.



Inclusive Pro Tips

Consider the needs of your group. Offering foam stickers could engage kids who enjoy tactile activities.

Inclusive Pro Tips

Consider the needs of your group. Take several breaks if any kids need to move around or have extra energy. Allow the kids to stand.

If folding or cutting the comic book is challenging for kids, assist them as needed.

Some kids might work better together for this activity. Pair the kids up with someone who can help guide them through the activity.

① What You Do

1. Gather the kids in a circle.
2. Show the prepared comic book example.
3. Give each kid a "Foldable Comic Book" Activity Page.
4. Set out the safety scissors.
5. Show the kids how to fold the book using the "Comic Book Instructions" Activity Page.

→ Assist the kids with this step as needed.

6. Once the pages are folded, help the kids make a cut along the dotted lines in the center of their comic book.
7. Place the coloring supplies in the center of the group.
8. As they kids color their books, guide them through the scenes and review the Bible Story:

→ Scene 1: Jacob gave Joseph a colorful coat.

→ Scene 2: Joseph's brothers were so jealous of him that they sold him off to traders who took him to Egypt.

→ Scene 3: Joseph went to work for Potiphar, but was accused of something he didn't do and was thrown in jail.

→ Scene 4: While he was in jail, Joseph rightly interpreted the dreams of the drink taster and baker.

→ Scene 5: Two years passed. Pharaoh had a dream he didn't understand. The drink taster remembered Joseph, and Joseph was brought before Pharaoh to explain Pharaoh's dream.

→ Scene 6: Pharaoh made Joseph second in command. Joseph oversaw the years of plenty, storing all the grain they could to prepare for seven years of famine. The famine brought Joseph's family to Egypt to ask for food. Joseph was able to forgive his brothers and save his family, bringing all of them to Egypt.

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Inclusive Pro Tips

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② What You Say

"Joseph's life was FULL of ups and many, many downs. But through it all—especially when he thought that everyone had forgotten him—Joseph chose to trust God. His faith kept him going; through the pit, to working in Potiphar's house, to prison, and to the palace. God was faithful. He stayed with Joseph and made something GOOD come out of some really difficult times. Joseph learned that **[BOTTOM LINE]** you can trust God when things get tough.

"Over and over in Joseph's story, the Bible says: 'God was with Joseph.' The same is true for you too. Not only that, but God promises that He is working for good in every situation in your life. God can bring good out of bad, friends. God loves you and He can be trusted with your fears, and worries, and disappointments. All of it! So this week, when you face something hard, like Joseph faced hard things, remember **[BOTTOM LINE]** you can trust God when things get tough.

[MAKE IT PERSONAL] Tell the kids an age-appropriate story about a time when you faced something tough. Maybe you had a frustrating morning before work or something bigger, like a friend or family member is sick. Talk to the kids about why you believe that **[Bottom Line]** you can trust God when things get tough. Share with the kids how you have seen God work tough things out for good in your life.

What You Need

What You Need

- Bible marked at Hebrews 11:1
- Floor Tape



① What You Do

1. Use the tape to create four separate tapelines.
 - Create one straight, one wavy, one zigzag, and one right angle
2. Choose a kid to open the Bible marked at Hebrews 11:1.
3. Read the verse out loud to the group.
4. Lead the kids to repeat the verse several times together.
5. Discuss any unfamiliar words from the verse.
6. Select four kids to stand at the end of each line.
7. Lead them to repeat the words of the Memory Verse as they walk along the lines.
8. Assist the kids with reciting the verse as needed.
9. Repeat with new kids until everyone has had a turn to walk down a path, reciting the Memory Verse.
10. Point to the different paths. Ask: "Which path was easiest to follow?"
 - Most kids should answer that the straight line was the easiest.
11. Gather the kids and discuss

② What You Say

"That was so fun! Great job reciting this month's Memory Verse! The straight path was the easiest to follow, wasn't it? I'm so glad to know that we can put all our trust in God, no matter what the path before us looks like. We might not be able to see everything, but we can be confident that God is with us through it all. Every straight path, every zigzag path with twists and turns—God is right there! We can have faith that we are not alone! Remember **[BOTTOM LINE]** you can trust God when things get tough, friends!"



Inclusive Pro-Tips

Consider the needs of your group. If a kid prefers to sit down while reciting the verse instead of traveling the tape lines, let them do so.

If a kid needs assistance walking the tape lines, invite another kid to walk alongside them.

① What You Do

1. Gather the kids in a circle.
2. Encourage the kids to think about a tough situation they faced this week.
→ Optional: If you completed the Application Activity, place the butcher paper in the center of the circle as a reminder.
3. Give the kids a few seconds to pray quietly on their own, asking God to help them remember that **[BOTTOM LINE]** you can trust God when things get tough.
4. After they've had a few moments to pray, close the group in prayer.

② What You Say

"Dear God, we know that You are a GREAT big God who loves us with a great BIG love! Thank You for the story of Joseph and how he chose to trust that You were with him, even through the tough stuff. When we face hard things, remind us that we don't face them alone. Help us trust that You are with us when things get tough. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

Transition → As adults arrive to pick up, encourage kids to point out the wavy lines on the butcher paper or the tape lines on the floor from the "Balancing Act" Activity as they talk about how **[BOTTOM LINE]** you can trust God when things get tough. If they made a comic book, encourage the kids to share Joseph's story and how God was always with Joseph!



Inclusive Pro-Tips

When you're praying with the kids, speak slowly and clearly, and give the kids time to say "Amen" with you at the end.
