When we follow these truths, we discover who we are, how to treat others, and where we fit in His bigger story.

Tuesday: Day One

Bible Story: David Anointed King (1 Samuel 16:1-13)

God chooses David to be the future king—not because he's the biggest or strongest, but because of his heart. While others saw a shepherd boy, God saw a leader. He teaches us that His definition of greatness is different than ours.

Supporting Verse: For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Ephesians 2:10

Waypoint: Brilliance | I am God's One-of-a-Kind Masterpiece

Small Group: In today's conversation, kids will talk about how God sees value in each of us, even when others might not notice. The Small Group questions will help them explore how they can see themselves the way God sees them and recognize the gifts God has placed inside them.

Wednesday: Day Two

Bible Story: Bible Story: Jesus Sees Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1–10)

Zacchaeus was a tax collector who most people didn't like, but Jesus saw him, called him by name, and chose to spend time with him. That encounter changed Zacchaeus's life and showed everyone that no one is too far gone for Jesus.

Supporting Verse: Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Romans 12:10

Waypoint: Waypoint: Boldness | Treat others like they matter.

Small Group: In today's conversation, kids will learn how Jesus noticed Zacchaeus and treated him with love and respect—even when others didn't. The Small Group questions will help kids explore how they can boldly treat others with kindness, include those who are left out, and reflect the way Jesus sees and values everyone.

Thursday: Day Three

Bible Story: The Great Banquet (Luke 14:15–24)

Jesus tells a story about a man who throws a huge banquet. When the invited guests make excuses, the man invites everyone—especially the unexpected and overlooked. The table is for everyone.

Supporting Verse: Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. Romans 15:7

Waypoint: Belonging | Make room for someone new.

Small Group: In today's conversation, kids will hear how God's invitation is wide open. The Small Group questions will help them think about what it means to include others, how to welcome someone new, and how to make space for others to belong—just like God does for us.
