What You Need

 Offering Container	1
 "Tic Tac Love" Activity Page	1

What You Do:

- Greet each kid by name with a fist bump, high-five, smile, or wave as they arrive!
- Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
- Pair the kids up.
- Give each pair a "Tic Tac Love" board and game pieces.
- Show them how to play Tic-Tac-Toe. One person will be "Jesus" and the other will be "Hearts."
- Invite them to play several rounds against each other.
- Encourage them to cheer for each other, even if they lose a round.

Bible Story Review

Like It or Not | Made to Play

What You Need

 Floor tape	1
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What You Do:

- Place a line of tape down the center of the room or your Small Group rug.
- Instruct all of the kids to stand on the line.
- Explain that one side of the line is the "Like" side and the other is the "Don't Like" side.
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What You Say:

"Tic-Tac-Toe is such a fun game! It's great to play with friends.-
[Transition] In our true story from the Bible today, we're going to hear about a man named Zacchaeus who didn't have many friends because he was a dishonest tax collector. But one day, he met Jesus, who saw him, and it changed everything! Let's go find out what happened."

What You Say:

"You know this story so well! People did not like Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector who cheated his neighbors. Since Zacchaeus was not very tall, he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree just to get a glimpse of Jesus. But Jesus looked up, called him by name, and said, '*I must stay at your house today*' (Luke 19:5 NIV). Jesus showed him love no matter what he had done, and that made all the difference. It's true that **[Bottom Line]** the love of Jesus can change things for the better."

Start by calling out some fun things and have them jump to the side that matches their opinion.

- "Pineapple on pizza!"
- "Doing homework!"
- "Touching slime!"
- "Building with LEGO®!"
- After a few fun ones, switch to reviewing the Bible Story. Say a statement about the Bible Story. If it happened in the story, instruct the kids to go to the "like" side. If it didn't happen, direct the kids to go to the "don't like" side.
 - "Zacchaeus was a very tall man." ("Don't like" side)
 - "Zacchaeus climbed a tree to see Jesus." ("Like" side)
 - "Jesus was angry with Zacchaeus." ("Don't like" side)
 - "Jesus went to Zacchaeus's house for dinner." ("Like" side)
 - "Zacchaeus decided to give back the money he had stolen." ("Like" side)

23 – Respond with Love | Made to Imagine

What You Need

 "Respond with Love" Activity Pages 0

What You Do:

- Read one of the scenario cards aloud.
- Ask the group, "What would you normally want to do in that situation?" (e.g., get mad, say something mean back)
- Then ask: "How can you respond with the love of Jesus instead?"
- Brainstorm kind and loving responses together.
- Continue with each of the scenarios

What You Say:

"It's not always easy to choose love, is it? But when we remember how Jesus loved Zacchaeus—even when he had done wrong things—it helps us. Even when everyone was whispering that Jesus had gone to be the 'guest of a sinner,' Jesus chose love. We can ask Jesus to help us show love to others too. Zacchaeus's response of generosity and making things right shows that **[Bottom Line] the love of Jesus can change things for the better.**"

23 – Draw the Verse | Made to Create

What You Need

 Bibles	Several
 Paper	1
 Coloring supplies	Several

What You Do:

- Give every kid a Bible and direct them to look up John 13:34.
- Demonstrate how to look up the verse using the Bible Navigation Tips below:

Finding verses for 2-3rd graders: Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (Hold up a Bible opened to the table of contents to show the kids what the page looks like.) When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find the name of the book in the list. When they find the book, lead them to look at the page number beside it. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find that book. Help the kids find the page. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find the correct chapter. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find the correct verse in that chapter.

- Repeat the verse aloud several times.
- Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
- Give each kid a piece of paper and coloring supplies.
- Give each kid one part of the verse to write and then illustrate.
- Kid 1: "I give
- Kid 2: you a new command.
- Kid 3: Love
- Kid 4: one another.
- Kid 5: You must
- Kid 6: love

What You Say:

"Your illustrations are awesome! These pictures will help us remember the verse! Jesus' command to love one another is so important. Jesus' love for Zacchaeus changed his life. Jesus told him, '*Today salvation has come to your house*' (Luke 19:9 NIV). When we follow Jesus' command, we also see that **[Bottom Line] the love of Jesus can change things for the better.**"

- Kid 7: one another,
- Kid 8: just as I
- Kid 9: have loved you."
- Kid 10: John 13:34
- If you have more than 10 kids, pair kids to work together. If you have fewer than 10 kids, give each kid more than one part to write and illustrate.
- Invite the kids to put their pieces of paper together. Read the verse together several times.

23 – Pray and Dismiss | Made to Reflect

What You Do:

Ask:

- Zacchaeus climbed a tree just to see Jesus. What do you think made him so eager to see Jesus—and what might that say about what was missing in his life?
- Jesus called Zacchaeus by name and wanted to spend time with him, even though others called Zacchaeus a "sinner." What does this teach you about how Jesus sees people who have messed up or feel left out?
- Zacchaeus didn't just feel loved—he changed. Why do you think experiencing Jesus' love made Zacchaeus want to make things right instead of being told to?
- The crowd judged Zacchaeus and whispered about him, but Jesus chose kindness. When have you seen someone judged by others, and how could you respond more like Jesus in that kind of moment?
- The story says that the love of Jesus changes people. How has knowing that Jesus loves you—no matter what—changed the way you see yourself or treat others?

What You Say:

"Thank you for sharing your hearts with Jesus. He loves you, and He is powerful enough to help with every single one of these things. Let's pray.

"Dear God, thank You for the story of Zacchaeus. It reminds us that Your love is so powerful. Please help us with the areas we talked to You about. We know that You can make things better. Help us to share Your love

What You Need

- 👤 Prayer jar from Week 1 1
- 👤 Bag of candy hearts from Week 1 1

What To Do:

- Ask the kids to think of one thing they would like to see Jesus change in their hearts for the better. It could be their bad attitude when it comes to doing math, how they're jealous of their little brother, or how they're tempted to lie in a situation because it seems easier.
- Invite them to think of that one thing and talk to Jesus silently and pray, "Dear Jesus, please change my heart in this area. I need Your help to make it better."
- When the kids are done praying silently, give them each a candy heart and encourage them to put it in the prayer jar.
- Explain that sometimes we are the ones who need to be prayed for. Sometimes it's our hearts that need to be changed for the better, and God loves to help us do that!
- Close in a group prayer.
- Store the Prayer Jar in a safe place to use again next week.
