

# Toddlers | W1



## Philip and the Man in the Chariot

### What You Need

 "Phillip and the Man in the Chariot" Activity Page 0

 "Tiny Bible" Activity Page 0

### What You Do:

*Before the Activity:* Copy "Philip and the Ethiopian" on cardstock, one per child. Copy "Tiny Bible" on cardstock and cut, one cutout per child. Fold each "Tiny Bible" and write each child's name on their paper.

*During the Activity:* Help each child stamp hearts on the inside of their Bible. Rub glue on the back of their tiny Bible and help each child place it on their paper with Philip and the Ethiopian.

**LEADER:** "Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come sit with me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (*hold up the Bible*) is about a man named Philip. Philip was friends with Jesus, and Philip loved God.

"Philip listened to God and went to find the man in the chariot. When Philip found him, the man was reading God's words but needed help understanding them. Philip helped him so he could hear from God. We can hear from God too when we read the Bible and look at the pictures, or when someone reads the Bible to us! The Bible has God's words in it, and it teaches us how to do what God says and love like Jesus. **[Bottom Line] The Bible teaches you the best things.**"

### What You Say:

*During the Activity:* "Look at this tiny Bible! The Bible teaches us the BEST things! Stamp hearts on the inside of your Bible. (*Pause.*) Great! (*Rub glue on the back of each child's Bible.*) Now let's add the Bible to your paper. Philip helped the man in the chariot understand God's words. The Bible has God's Words in it, and **[Bottom Line] The Bible teaches you the best things.**"
