

Toddlers | W3



What You Do:

Before the Activity: Copy "Philip Helps" on cardstock, one per child. Write each child's name on their paper.

During the Activity: Encourage children to color their picture.

LEADER: "Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (*hold up the Bible*) begins with Philip. (*Draw a simple stick figure of Philip*) Philip was friends with Jesus and Philip loved God. (*Draw a heart next to Philip.*)

"There was a man in a chariot who was reading God's words. (*Draw a chariot with a simple stick figure in it reading a book.*) God told Philip to go find the man in the chariot, so Philip ran! (*Draw a stick figure running to the chariot.*) When Philip found him, (*Draw Philip next to the man in the chariot reading.*) he sat and read God's words with him and Peter told him that Jesus wants to be his friend forever. The Bible teaches us how to do what God says and love like Jesus. **[Bottom Line] The Bible teaches you the best things."**

What You Say:

During the Activity: "The Bible is filled with God's words. In our story, Philip helped the man in the chariot understand God's words and he told the man Jesus wanted to be his friend forever. Decorate your picture of Philip and the man in the chariot. **[Bottom Line] The Bible teaches you the best things."**
