What You Need

① What You Do

Pray for your group before they arrive → Pray for kids who will visit your group for the first time. Ask God to remind you (*and your group*) that God is good and that He is always working for good. Pray for any visitors that they would find a safe place in your group to wonder and ask questions. Thank God for inviting ordinary people like Mary into His extraordinary rescue plan. Ask the Holy Spirit to help preteens recognize that God's great love for them led Him to work for years and years so they could be close friends with Him again! And because He loves them so much, He is always working for good in their lives, and they can trust Him!

1. Welcome kids by name as they arrive with a high-five, fist bump, or a wave.
2. Invite any kids who brought an offering to place it in the offering container.
3. Spread the "Headline Strips" Activity Pages out on the floor or on a table.
4. As the kids arrive, explain to them that a headline is like a chapter or a story's title.
5. Set out the pencils.
6. Instruct each kid to pick a headline from the "Headline Strips" Activity Page and guess what happens next in the story (or fill in the blank) by writing their answers on the paper under the headline.
7. Encourage the kids to get creative.
8. Gather the kids together and let them share their headline strips and guesses with the group.

② What You Say

"You all came up with some creative Christmas stories, friends! We might not always know what's next, but we can know that God is always working toward something good! God is always working on writing a good story! Today, we'll look at a true story that He worked on for years and years because He loves us—His amazing plan to send Jesus to rescue us so we could be close to Him again!

[Transition] "In today's true story from the Bible, we'll discover how an angel visited Mary, Jesus' mother, to tell her that she would be giving birth to the Savior of the WORLD! It's a pretty epic story, and it was all a part of God's BIG plan that God had been working and working on throughout history. Let's go find out more!"

Transition → Lead your group to the Large Group area.

1. What are your plans this Christmas?
2. Since God worked on His great rescue plan for years and years to pay for sin so He could be your close friend, how does that show He feels about you?
3. Why is Jesus the best news we could share?
4. If you could tell one friend or family member the good news about Jesus, what would you want them to know first?

Inclusive Pro Tips



Be sensitive to kids who may need extra time to process their thoughts and respond. Be patient and create a safe space where everyone has a chance to share when they're ready.

Frequently check for understanding during discussion by asking questions like, "Can someone share in their own words what we're talking about?"

① What You Do

1. Before you begin, write Luke 2:11 on the dry-erase board and erase several words. The kids will identify the missing words during this activity.
2. Give every kid a Bible and invite them to look up Luke 2:11.

*Finding verses with 4th-5th graders

- ① Ask kids to tell you if the book of the Bible they're looking for is in the Old Testament or New Testament. If it's in the Old, instruct kids to flip slowly, starting at the front of the Bible and heading toward the back, until they find the book they're looking for. If it's in the New, instruct kids to start flipping from the back, going forward to find the book they're looking for.
- ② When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers.
- ③ Once they find the chapter, explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell kids to find the verse within the chapter they've already found.

3. Repeat the verse together several times.
4. Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids, like 'Messiah.' If you have a lot of returning kids from week 1, ask them what 'Messiah' means. If not, use this recap to share:
 - "Messiah" is a special title that means: "Anointed One" or "Chosen One."
 - A long time before Jesus was born, God promised His people that He would send someone to rescue them, to make things right, so they could be close to God again. That person would be the Messiah!
 - This verse that we shared today is part of the message the angel delivered to the shepherds that Jesus is the Messiah! The angel was saying: "This is the One God promised! He's the Rescuer, the forever King, the One we've all been waiting for to make us right with God again!"
5. Put the Bibles away.
6. Gather the kids together in front of the dry-erase board.
7. Let them take turns guessing the missing words from the verse.
8. Continue changing the missing words and calling on various kids to guess them.
9. Ask:
10. The verse says a Savior has been born "to you." How does it feel knowing Jesus came for YOU personally?
11. If you had to share this verse with a friend in your own words, what would you say?

Make It Personal with Prayer

What You Need

- Index cards
- Pencils



① What You Do

1. Give every kid an index card and a pencil.
2. Invite them to reflect on today's [Bottom Line] God always had a plan to send Jesus.
3. Lead a salvation conversation with the kids.
 - Say: "God always had a plan to send Jesus. That plan wasn't just for Mary or the shepherds or the people living back then. It was for YOU too! God's plan has always been to make a way for us to be close to Him, and that's why He sent Jesus."
 - "The truth is, we all mess up (that's called sin). Sin keeps us from being close to God. BUT God's plan was to send Jesus to take the punishment for our sin so we could be close friends with God again! When you believe in Jesus, you're saying, 'I know You died for me, and I want to follow You.' That's the BEST news you could ever accept. If you've never told Jesus you believe in Him and want to follow Him, you can do that anytime, even right now, as you pray."
4. Encourage the kids to take a quiet moment to talk to God.
 - Say: "Take a quiet moment. You might want to thank God for sending Jesus. You might want to write a prayer telling Jesus you believe in Him and want to follow Him! Or you might just want to tell God what you're feeling right now."
5. Instruct the kids to use the index card and a pencil to write a prayer to God.
6. Spend some time in quiet prayer.

Inclusive Pro Tips



Give kids the option to doodle to God if writing is difficult for them.
