## Lesson 02: What is God Like?

### Small Group Guide

#### Bottom Line:

*God is eternal, all-powerful, all-knowing, and always present.*

#### Memory Verse:

*"Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God."*

*Psalm 90:2 (NIV)*

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## Activity One: Superpower Showdown

### Introduction for Leaders

In Large Group, we learned that God has attributes that describe who He is. But before we talk about God's "superpowers," let's talk about yours.

### Pick Your Superpower

**Go around the circle and ask:** "If you could have one real superpower, what would it be and why?"

Read the options first to help kids think:

- Super strength
- The ability to fly
- Invisibility
- Super speed
- Mind reading

### Silly Superpowers

**Now say:** "Okay, now we're going to get ridiculous. If you had to choose one of these silly superpowers, which would you want?"

Read slowly and let them vote:

- The ability to turn broccoli into cookies

- The power to always land every basketball shot
- The ability to speak fluent dog
- The power to pause time for 10 seconds
- The ability to instantly clean your room by snapping your fingers

Let them choose one and explain why.

### Part 3 – God’s Superpowers

**Now pivot:** “Today we learned that God actually has real ‘superpowers.’ Not silly ones. Not pretend ones. Real ones.”

Briefly review:

- God is Eternal – He has no beginning or end.
- God is Omnipresent – He is everywhere at the same time.
- God is Omniscient – He knows everything.
- God is Omnipotent – He is all-powerful.
- God is Immutable – He never changes.

### Part 4 – Quick Match Challenge

Instead of formal matching, make it fast and verbal. The leader reads a statement. Kids call out the attribute.

1. “God has always existed and always will.”
2. “God is with you at school and at home at the same time.”
3. “God knows what you’re thinking right now.”
4. “Nothing is impossible for God.”
5. “God’s love doesn’t change when your mood changes.”

### Reflection Question (Short)

Ask one:

- Which of God’s “superpowers” is most comforting to you? Why?
- How is it good for you that God has these abilities?

**Reinforce:** “God doesn’t just have power. He uses His power to love, protect, and care for us.”

# Activity Two: Follow the Clues

## Introduction for Leaders

In Large Group, we played Clue Lab and acted like detectives. We looked at clues in a bedroom and figured out what kind of person lived there.

Tonight, we're going to do something similar — but instead of looking at bedrooms, we're going to look at creation and Scripture. The goal is to help kids see that we can know real things about God because He has revealed Himself.

## Clue Discussion

**Say:** "If you were a detective and you saw these clues, what would they tell you?"

Read each "clue" and let kids respond briefly.

**Clue 1:** A giant mountain range, the ocean, and millions of stars in the sky.  
What does that tell us about God?

**Clue 2:** The story of the Red Sea parting to rescue God's people.  
What does that tell us about God?

**Clue 3:** Jesus was born as a baby.  
What does that tell us about God?

**Clue 4:** God knows the number of hairs on your head.  
What does that tell us about God?

Keep answers simple:

Powerful. Creative. Protective. Loving. Personal. All-knowing.

## Discussion Questions (Activity One)

Ask 1-2 of these:

- Why is it important that God shows us what He is like?
- Which "clue" about God stood out to you the most and why?

Reinforce Bottom Line.

# Final Discussion Questions

## Kindergarten / 1st Grade

- Where can we look to learn about God?
- What is one thing you learned about God tonight?
- Is there anywhere God is not?

## 2nd / 3rd Grade

- How does creation help us know what God is like?
- Which attribute of God is the most comforting to you? Why?
- Why is it important that God never changes?
- How does knowing God is always with you affect your week?

## 4th / 5th Grade

- How does what you believe about God shape how you live?
- Why do you think God chose to reveal Himself through both creation and Scripture?
- Which attribute of God feels hardest to understand? Why?
- How should knowing who God is change the way you pray?
